Next was walk over to the OSU campus for a tour of the new Peavy Forest Science Center in construction. The three-story, 1.2 million board feet building is being constructed of Oregon-made cross-laminated timber. The innovative design will be both attractive and also an incredible learning facility. Also, new technology is being installed to not only withstand a big earthquake, but students will be able the monitor the CLT panels in various ways throughout the life of the building.

For any who ever doubted the strength of CLT, those doubts were squelched at the OSU lab, where a beam was put to the test. The beam being tested finally split at approximately 8,000 pounds of pressure — not that the beams will ever see that kind of stress.

For those that didn't have to run back to work, the last stop was the Block 15 Brewery. It was a nice end to a busy, but productive meeting.
